



## The Ballads o Anna Gordon Brown

## Primary activities

Anna Gordon wis born in 1747 in Aiberdeen, a time when ballads wir susteened throu the oral tradition an in prent bi circulation o popular broadsides an chap-buiks. Aunts, nurses an auldwives frae upper Deeside wir said in a letter scrievit bi Anna's faither tae hae been the springheid o Anna's ballad collection.

In the 'Brown C' manuscript Anna Gordon offers an introduction tae "Thomas the Rhymer & Queen of Elfland", a ballad also kent as "Tam Lin" or "Tamlane"; 'The tradition concerning this ballad is that Thomas Rhymer when young, was carried away by the Queen of Elfland or Fairyland, who retained him in her service for seven years, during which period he is supposed to have acquired the wisdom which afterwards made him so famous."

Tam Lin has been imprentit among ithers bi Robert Burns an Walter Scott, an maist recently retelt bi Lari Don.
